From the Editor

I've been reminded this year of a few things that are worth carrying along as a matter of course on a long ride:

Endurolytes. If the RMCC did product endorsements, this would be the official caplet of the club. These caplets, made by Hammer Nutrition. replace essential electrolytes that you lose through sweating. Many sport drinks help as well, but on hot summer days, those may not provide enough. Taking a few Endurolytes on a long ride can really help make up the difference and help you ride a lot stronger toward the end.

Immodium. This was suggested to me years ago. On a recent ride, I got about halfway in and realized, "Uh oh." The short version is, having a couple of these with me allowed me to get home without any major issues developing.

Ibuprofen or other pain reliever. As a general rule, taking these during a ride is not a good idea, in part because they dehydrate you. Sometimes, however, you do need something just to get to get back.

Tire boots. Those things that cause flats along the road often damage the tire itself. Boots are designed to cover cuts in the tire and will allow you to finish the ride.

All of these can help you get through a long ride, and the best thing is—they don't weigh much!
