# Norman F. Lewis February 23, 1948 – December 28, 2007

Long time club member Norm Lewis passed away recently after a long battle with ALS.

Norm Lewis was both an avid randonneur and a volunteer for the RMCC. Norm's big year as a randonneur was 2003 when he rode two 300K, one 200K, and one 600K brevets. He capped those successes by completing Paris-Brest-Paris. Norm continued this line of successes in 2004 with finishes in one 200K, one 300K, and one 1000K brevets. The effort of these two years netted Norm the coveted Randonneur 5000 award. Norm also participated in fleches in 2004 and 2005. Giving back to the club, Norm volunteered to start three rides in 2004 and six in 2005. Norm's final brevet was the 200K on May 7, 2005. At the ALS Walk in September 2006, Norm told me that the physical activity he missed most was cycling.

As impressive and time-consuming as Norm's cycling accomplishments were, they made up only one dimension of his life. He got to see a large part of the world as a service kid. Norm married Linda in 1970 just before heading to Vietnam with the Army. Norm was devoted to his four sons, John, Nathan, Matthew, and Michael, and his daughter, Laura. Working as an engineer in the mining industry, he helped with the extraction of uranium, copper, and gold. When the bottom fell out of those markets, Norm changed careers, no easy task with three toddlers, and became a civil engineer. He was involved in the construction of many of the skyscrapers that dot Denver's skyline.

When Norm wasn't busy raising his family or working, he was pursing his love of the great outdoors. To further this end, he could be found in his back yard working on an aging, red Land Rover his parents had given him while he was in college. With baling wire, bubble gum, parts secured on part-seeking expeditions, and the help of his sons, he kept the Land Rover running. The Land Rover let Norm see those places no man had driven to before. Norm also had a knack for planning, organizing, and doing death hikes with his church youth group and his sons. He was the patient coach who made sure that no one was left behind, and he gently showed those in doubt that they had the strength to finish the hike.

When times were tough, Norm reassured Linda that they would get by just fine. Norm did not complain about his illness because he was a good man, who took comfort in his family, his friends, his church, and his memories of the great

## The RMCC 2008 (After) New Years Day Century; Or a Windy Welcome to 2008

After the weather debacle that forced cancellation of last years ride, hopes were high. However, Colorado's fickle winter weather did cause a postponement of a few days so the Parkand-Ride lot and roads could clear up for safer riding conditions and warmer temperatures that would help make the ride more enjoyable.

Saturday the 5th was much warmer in comparison. However, a somewhat major trade off was lots of wind; not as bad as 2 years ago, but still enough to give riders pause with the extra effort that is required to put in a long ride at this time of year.

About 17 riders were on hand at the start. Several Paris-Brest-Paris veterans, brevet riders, our tandem riders, and people of varied interests made for a good mix of cyclists, several of whom made the trip from Colorado Springs for the ride.

We left Northglenn with an easterly tailwind which helped our warm up. This changed to a strong headwind out of the west by the time the top of "The Wall" above Superior was reached. Thankfully that didn't last very long (note to self: Careful or I might be facing a lynch mob of sorts at the next ride start!) That exposed section seemed to be the worst part of the ride since it was a very strong, straight-on head wind. The rest of the time when the winds were contrary they were quartering from the left or right — easier on the legs but harder on the upper body and brain (quite fatiguing unless you are mentally prepared to do battle), especially if there are gusts due to hills or traffic.

Partial head and cross winds "followed" until North of Boulder where we had a nice tailwind for the rollers on Highway 36. Several larger groups of riders from local race teams were out on the road in the Boulder area, starting to build base mileage for the coming season (Racing starts the end of February with the "Frostbite Time Trial" up North of Fort Collins so they are already ramping up.). Very nice to see so many other friendly cyclists out riding.

### The 2008 Ride Schedule

Enclosed with this month's newsletter is the 2008 ride schedule. This is the result of many hours of work from the schedule committee. Going into this year, there were a number of issues that we knew we needed to address.

First, a number of rides headed east needed route improvements. Roads out that way continue to see more and more car and truck traffic, making them less enjoyable for cycling. The positive side of the coin, however, is that some roads are now paved that weren't in the past. As such, several changes were made to the rides out of Aurora and the ones out of of Northglenn that head east to put them on quieter roads. We also made changes to some of the rides in the Deer Creek/Conifer/Evergreen area to provide a better mix of riding and to add in some new roads that we haven't used before. When you do those rides this year, please be sure to take a map so you don't head the wrong way!

Speaking of maps, this is the second area that we focused on this year. Quite honestly, there have been many changes to street routing and intersection configuration, as well as minor changes to the rides themselves that have occurred over recent years, but that the scheduling committee would forget about when we we worked on the schedule and route maps in the fall. As such, information that was once very accurate has fallen somewhat out of date, and we've been relying on ride starters to note any issues with the map.

As such, we poured through the maps and cue sheets in detail to find these changes, any inaccuracies, and things that needed additional clarification. Additionally, the format of the map and cue sheets is being enhanced to provide additional information. Our route maps have always been excellent given the wide variety of rides we offer; we hope we have made them even better for this year. Because we do have so many routes it really isn't possible to to be correct in every last detail, but we are doing our best!

Regardless, we strove to basically keep the strengths of the existing schedule, which are many. First, there is a huge variety of rides, both involving climbing and those that are flatter. If you ride with the RMCC every weekend, you won't get bored of our rides! Second, our spring schedule follows a progression of steadily increasing ride length and difficulty to help you train for summer tours, the brevet series, and other rides like the Triple Bypass.

We look forward to seeing you on the road this year!
